#### Local Plan moves forward

In April at the end of Stage 1 of the examination of the Council's proposed new Local Plan, the independent planning Inspector gave the go ahead to move on to Stage 2 of the process

The Stage 1 hearings cover legal compliance issues including the 'duty to cooperate', if this requirement was not met the Local Plan would not have been permitted to move to Stage 2. Examination hearings for Stage 2 continue during June and July.

# A role for young people in shaping the future of Royal Tunbridge Wells

#### There's an exciting opportunity for two young people (aged 16-22) to take part in shaping the future of Royal Tunbridge Wells town centre.

The voluntary role will involve attending and contributing to meetings of the working group that has been set up to deliver a future for the town centre, enabling it to recover, evolve and flourish over the coming years and ensure its long-term vitality and viability. If you have ideas about how the town centre can grow to provide opportunities for younger people (or any other part of the community), we would love to hear from you. Meetings, that are expected to last a few hours, will be held approximately once a month. There may also be scope for further activities at public exhibitions as the plan progresses.

Being involved in the working group will provide valuable experience of the process of local governance and community-led projects which could be used to support further/higher education applications and job applications. The role may be of specific interest if you are considering further study or a career in planning, geography and economics.

#### Public Spaces Protection Orders

# New Public Spaces Protection Orders (PSPO) approved by the Council's Cabinet in April are expected to be in place by the end of June 2022.

The three new three-year orders are a result of consultations with residents in 2021. The majority of responses to the consultations were clearly in favour of measures being introduced.

#### St John's Park, Tunbridge Wells

A PSPO will put a year-round curfew in place between the hours of 11pm and 5am. The curfew means no-one should be within the boundaries of the park at that time. This adds to the existing PSPO for alcohol control at the park. It is not an offence to drink alcohol there but it is an offence to fail to comply with an authorised officer's request to cease drinking or surrender alcohol.

#### **Royal Tunbridge Wells multi-storey car parks**

A no loitering or unauthorised activities PSPO will cover five town centre car parks: Crescent Road, Great Hall, Meadow Road, Royal Victoria Place and Torrington. The definition of loitering does not apply to rough sleeping and we will not be using a PSPO to ban rough sleepers from public spaces.

#### **Sherwood Lake**

The introduction of a PSPO here will introduce restrictions on night-time fishing on the west and south side of the lake and alcohol use at any time. The restrictions mean no-one shall fish, loiter, erect bivouacs, tents or similar structures within the restricted area between the hours of 7pm and 7am. Also, no-one should consume alcohol or be in possession of an open container of alcohol within the restricted area. A map of the restricted area can be seen at

Failure to comply with a PSPO (excluding alcohol control) may result in a fine, on conviction, of £1,000. A Fixed Penalty Notice of £100 may be used as an alternative to prosecution.

Enforcement of the order will be undertaken by council officers and Kent Police. Fixed penalty notices will only be served by council officers either at the time an offence is taking place, or on a subsequent day if police attend the location and provide evidence to TWBC that an offence has taken place.

## The community of Tunbridge Wells borough helps the people of Ukraine

Since the conflict started in February, the Council has been working with government agencies and local groups to co-ordinate activity and avoid duplication of effort to support the Homes for Ukraine scheme and Ukrainian's coming to the UK under the family scheme.

In such a short space of time so much has been achieved locally to help Ukrainian's settle into the community as quickly as possible.

Networks are forming and friendships built as Ukrainian guests meet others who are in a similar situation.

Gratitude to local designers, yoyo whose staff gave up evenings and weekends to work with community groups to create a website full of vital information to help guests settle into the borough as quickly as possible, support hosts and further information about how you can help. The website is available in English, Ukrainian and Russian twhelpsukraine.info

The Council has produced a welcome guide which is also available in English, Ukrainian and Russian. Hints and tips for hosts have been circulated, and meetings held for hosts to share updates and ask questions.

There is also a regular newsletter for hosts and guests to sign up to at **twbc.online/ukrainiannewsletter** to find out the latest information about activities and events in the area.

A lot of great work is happening, but none of this would be possible without the fantastic spirit and kindness of residents, many of whom have wanted to help in some way, from hosting a family, making donations, or giving up their time to volunteer.

#### **Community effort**

**Ukraine Relief Group (URG)** was set up to help Ukrainians suffering from the current conflict, taking aid to Ukraine, and supporting those arriving in the borough of Tunbridge Wells with essential supplies.

URG is now based out of TN2 Community Centre which enables them to focus on both sides, in UK and Ukraine. Guests can now come to TN2 and look through the donations and take away what is needed for them. Hosts are also welcome.

As families look through the donations, children can play in a dedicated space.

Residents have been so generous with donations of clothing, medical supplies, toiletries, baby and toddler equipment, toys and more.

Weekly updates are posted on URG's Facebook page with items that are in need. **Search Ukraine Relief Group** 

#### Tunbridge Wells Ukraine Refugee Support Group

This subgroup of Tunbridge Wells Welcomes Refugees provides the 'wrap around' support for Ukrainian refugees coming to stay in Tunbridge Wells with the help of volunteers.

The group provides advice and support on processes such as registering to host a family or the visa application process.

The Tunbridge Wells Ukraine Refugee Support Group also provides ongoing information for Tunbridge Wells hosts, and where information is shared on lessons learnt, processes, translations etc. They also share hosting tips and information.

They are providing English conversation classes via Tunbridge Wells Welcomes Refugees and other volunteers. This is to support Ukrainians in the community who are not attending ESOL (English to Speakers of Other Languages) language qualifications or want top up practice. 



### Local Green Champion

Our Local Green Champion for this edition is Chris Murphy from the Tunbridge Wells Repair Café!





Chris organises the Tunbridge Wells Repair Café, a not-for-profit monthly group which started in March 2020 and has been a huge local success. The repair café has 27 repair stations repairing all sorts of items from electricals, textiles, bikes and computers, to jewellery, mechanical objects and knife sharpening. It is staffed by a group of more than 60 fantastic volunteers.

Repair cafés challenge the way we think about the lifecycle of our household items, highlighting how we can give broken or damaged items a new lease of life.

We live in a throw-away society where many of the products we buy are designed with planned obsolescence and as a result broken household items are often discarded as we may lack the skills needed to repair them.

In 2019, Chris started to organise the first Tunbridge Wells Repair Café the concept spoke to his love for the environment, helping impact climate change and people. In only four months he managed to find enough support to host the first event which took place just before lockdown hit in 2020. On average, they repair about 95 items at each repair café and about two thirds of these are successful. People give a voluntary contribution if they wish to; this is how the café is funded. Encouraging people to give the Tunbridge Wells Repair Café a try, Chris said: 'The quieter repair stations are those fixing bikes, textiles and computers, so please come and visit if you need help with these. The most popular station is always household and garden electrical items'.

#### Sustainable Warmth scheme

Help is available to insulate your home to make it warmer for you, reduce your energy bills and be better for the environment.

#### Act now and apply before next winter

The Sustainable Warmth scheme is a government-funded initiative delivered by Tunbridge Wells Borough Council and Warmworks to support energy-saving improvements in people's homes. The scheme aims to help manage household fuel bills, and make homes warmer, more comfortable, and more energy efficient.

Check now to see if you are eligible to receive help under this new scheme.

If eligible, improvements offered under the Sustainable Warmth scheme are then assessed following a survey of the home, which is carried out by one of Warmworks' qualified surveyors.

The replacement or repair of fossil fuel heating systems, such as gas, oil, or LPG (liquid petroleum gas) boilers is not available under this scheme.

#### **Eligible home improvements**

The scheme offers a wide range of insulation measures and renewable heating technologies, such as air source heat pumps, which are designed to reduce the impact of heating homes on the environment.

#### Potential home improvements could include:

- wall insulation
- loft insulation
- air source, ground source or hybrid heat pumps
- biomass boilers
- double or triple glazing to replace single glazing
- energy efficient doors
- · thermostats and heating controls
- · hot water tank insulation

#### Eligible households

The scheme is open to homeowners and private tenants in rented accommodation, with a low annual income, and where the home is less energy efficient, with an EPC rating of D to G.

For people who live in a rented property, the landlord will need to provide permission to install energy-saving improvements and contribute a third of the installation costs.

Households also need to meet eligibility criteria to qualify for funding.

The scheme is being managed on our behalf by Warmworks.

Inspired by the Felixstowe Community Nature Reserve, Kent High Weald Partnership is asking residents and businesses if you can offer a space (2m² or more) to give over to nature. This could be in your garden, a window box, your office

#### **Perfect parks**

Across the borough there are some beautiful places to visit and green spaces where we can enjoy nature. Parks, playing fields and play areas in the towns and villages are usually looked after by the local parish or town council and in central Tunbridge Wells by TWBC with the invaluable help of the Friends groups.

#### **New statue in Dunorlan Park**

The long-empty plinth in the Grecian temple in Dunorlan Park, Royal Tunbridge Wells is now supporting a new statue donated by a member of the park's Friends group. The temple was previously home to The Dancing Girl, by Victorian sculptor William Theed, until the statue was stolen in 2006.

#### **Buddi bench**

Have you noticed the buddi bench in Calverley Grounds opposite the basketball court? Donated by resident Seth Hunter, the idea is that by taking a seat on the bench you're happy to join in an informal conversation with anyone who chooses to join you.

#### Peckish in the park?

In Tunbridge Wells the larger parks are home to very popular independent cafés. In **Dunorlan Park** the café overlooks the lake and is a great spot for breakfast before a dog walk or a well-deserved reward following the Saturday morning parkrun.

In **Grosvenor and Hilbert Park** Table 8 Café is centrally located by the children's play area, bowling green and The Hub, perfect for a post-school visit or a weekend treat

Calverley Grounds has a choice of places for you, the café overlooking the central green area or the inside community cafe just next to the Calverley Adventure Playground where you'll often find seasonal events taking place.

The newest addition to the parks is even flow in the park, a family-run cafe in **St John's Recreation Ground** serving the local residents, school students and visitors to the park (including dogs!).



#### New Changing Places toilet at Bedgebury National Pinetum

The Council has been awarded £40,000 towards the provision of accessible public toilets from the Department for Levelling Up, Housing and Communities' Changing Places public toilets initiative.

The funding will be used to develop a new Changing Places facility in partnership with Forestry England at Bedgebury National Pinetum, allowing more visitors to enjoy the beauty of this award-winning visitor attraction.



Penny Veck, Visitor Services Manager at Forestry England's Bedgebury National Pinetum, said:

The installation of a Changing Places toilet at the site will help Bedgebury National Pinetum to be more accessible for our visitors and help connect everyone with the nation's forests. Bedgebury National Pinetum offers a world class tree collection and a place where visitors can enjoy the beauty and diversity of conifers in every season, and this new facility will mean many more people can explore and feel welcome in this special place.'

In addition to the new facility at Bedgebury some of the funding received by the Council will be used to relocate the Changing Place in Royal Tunbridge Wells town centre.

Changing Places toilets are designed for use by severely disabled people who need specialised facilities when they are out and about.

#### **Gym equipment for Dunorlan Park**

Look out for new gym equipment coming to Dunorlan Park, Royal Tunbridge Wells. Seven easily accessible exercise stations are to be situated near the children's playground and overlooking the lake. Rotary in Tunbridge Wells has raised over £17,000 for the equipment. The robust array of outdoor exercise machines will be a great facility for the many residents of the town who regularly use the park for their fitness regime, and perhaps encourage more people to do the same.



Tunbridge Wells Rotary Club president, Martin Atkinson, commented: 'Our club celebrated its centenary in 2021-22. We wanted to present something of lasting benefit to the people of Tunbridge Wells. The nation's health has been a big issue recently, so we thought something to improve fitness and wellbeing would be appropriate.

'Working in partnership with The Rotary Club of the Pantiles, we held several fundraising events over the past year. We are also extremely grateful to Royal Tunbridge Wells Round Table for a generous donation from the proceeds of last year's firework display, held - fittingly - in Dunorlan Park!'

The fundraising efforts over the last year are a great example of what can be achieved by groups working together for the benefit of the community. As well as the various events the clubs and their members contributed generously and the Rotary South East District administration has provided a grant.

Rotary has the support of the Friends group and worked closely throughout with the Council who will oversee the installation as well as maintain and insure the equipment.



# St John's Park & Meadows The 'Love Fountain'

Tunbridge Wells
Borough Council is a key
partner in a project that
will see the restoration of
the iconic water fountain
in St John's Park and
Meadows (pictured).

The fountain, donated to the borough by Joseph Horatio Love in 1920, was originally crafted in fine, Royal Doulton tiles, the most ornate of which exist in a frieze at its base. The Council is partnering with The Friends of St John's Park and Meadows and with Refresh Tunbridge Wells (Refresh) to restore the fountain and install nearby seating. The fountain will be planted up as a public art project, to create a new, exciting viewpoint.



The cost of the fountain's restoration will be met from developer contributions arising from the nearby 'The Dairy' housing complex. The funds required for the seating will be the subject of a crowdfunding campaign to be run jointly by the Friends group and Refresh.






